





Population pyramids are used to identify the proportions of the Latino population that are within each sex/age category. Compared with the total population statewide, Latinos have a greater proportion of the population in the younger age groups.

Chart 4. Types of Family and Non-Family Household Living Arrangements



The chart above shows the county proportion of all Latino households in each of the categories for 2000 and 2010. Statewide, the Latino population is more likely than the total population to live in family households.





The chart above shows homeownership rates for Latino households in the county. Statewide, there was a slight decrease in owner occupancy between 2000 and 2010.
